

Tryreading?

What's a Meristem*?

Who?

A gathering of 2 to 4 people willing to read the Bible - of any age, background or stage of belief, generally single-sex.

Why?

- to grow in our understanding of God
- to build friendships

When?

Anytime it can be fitted in, without eating in to prime time (so not evenings, family time, etc.). It might meet early morning, lunchtime, on the way home from work, when shifts coincide etc.

Where?

Anywhere convenient - home, office, church, pub, the train etc.

How long?

Usually once a week for 7 weeks, but flexible. You may of course stop at any point. But if you are interested and wish to continue, you will be welcome.

What if ...

... more than five people want to come? Simple: the group splits into two*.

The Format

A *meristem* lasts about ³/₄ hour, though the discussion time can be extended if all agree.

It may include the following parts:

- 1) Tea / bite to eat (10 minutes)
- 2) A Reading (2 mins) from a Gospel / account of Jesus' life.
- 3) Any questions? (2 mins) a full list, whether or not an answer has already been thought of.
- 4) **Discussion** (20 mins)
 Answering the questions raised, and a
 free exchange of views!
- 5) Conclusion (5 mins)
 A key verse and the main point
 What does it show us about God?
 What should we do?
- 6) **Sharing** (5 mins)
 Joys and trials self, work and family,
 in confidence
- 7) **Prayer** (1 min)

It always ends at the pre-arranged time.

The Bible in a Meristem

Christians believe that in and through the Bible, God speaks and reveals Himself to human beings. We think therefore that *the Bible* is 'the teacher' and so we *all* come to learn from it.

At the heart of the Bible, Jesus says:

God so loved the world

that he gave his only Son,

that whoever believes in Him

should not perish

but have everlasting life.

(John chapter 3 verse 16)

The aim of a 'meristem' is to consider the truth of this statement. To do this we will look at and discuss our views on one of the four 'Gospels' in the Bible, which give accounts of Jesus life.

All opinions will be considered

All views will be respected.

All questions will be acknowledged - even if they remain unanswered!

^{*} Biologists give the name 'Meristem' to areas in plants which are *growing*: cells are added as they *divide*. (From Greek *meristos*, 'divisible')
